

2023 Garbage and Recycling Holiday Schedule

By contract, Republic Services is eligible to suspend collection of residential and commercial trash and recycling for the following holidays: Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

In general, trash and recycling collections missed due to an observed holiday will be made on the next regular collection day. **An exception is when missed residential recycling falls on Christmas and New Year's Day. The alternate collection for these days will be on the Saturday after Christmas.** No services, either residential or commercial, are provided on Sundays.

Residential trash resumes - Monday, November 27

Residential recycling resumes - Thursday, November 30

Commercial services resume - Friday, November 24

Christmas Day (Monday, December 25)

No services on Monday, December 25

Residential trash resumes - Thursday, December 28

Residential recycling resumes - Saturday, December 30

Commercial services resume - Tuesday, December 26
