



Storm Drain Marking Program Volunteer Fact Sheet



WHAT:

The Storm Drain Marking Program is an initiative to place a “This Drain for Rain, Flows to Creek” placard on storm drain inlets throughout the city of Mansfield. The placards and adhesive, door-hangers, and locations of neighborhoods are supplied through the City of Mansfield Stormwater Management program. Instructions on applying the placards to storm drains and safety equipment and instructions are distributed with the placards to ensure proper placement and safety considerations.



WHO:

Volunteers make this awareness effort a success!! Groups are strongly encouraged to participate. At least one person over 18 years of age must be present with the group.



WHERE:

Various residential neighborhoods throughout the city.



WHY:

Water entering our storm drains is NOT treated. It flows directly from the storm drainpipe into a local pond, creek, or lake. Common pollutants like: used motor oil and anti-freeze, grass clippings, litter, used cooking oil, and other items harm our local waterways when dumped down our storm drains. This program helps make residents aware of the effects of their actions.



HOW:

Volunteers are asked to apply placards to the concrete portions of storm drain inlets, and place door-hangers or brochures on residents doors or in their mailboxes.
